

Inwood City Council
July 10, 2023

Inwood City Council met in regular session on Monday, July 10, 2023 at 6:30 pm in the Council Chambers. Mayor Gerald Brands called the meeting to order. Council Members present: Rick Rozeboom, Chad Evans, Mark Timmerman, Kyle Knobloch, and Becca Bixler. Also present: Adam Hutchings, Jamie Van Beek, Kenny Scholten, and Natalie Bohlke.

Adam Hutchings, representing Stockwell Engineering, visited with Council about the Faber Drive Project. Construction is ahead of schedule.

Jamie Van Beek presented his monthly maintenance report. The water fountain at the park has been repaired. Van Beek spent a lot of time preparing for the 4th of July celebration. He completed 19 locates, sprayed at the lagoon, and has been busy with the pool. Van Beek is working with R&S Venture Tree Grinding to grind the trees at the yard waste site annually.

Kenny Scholten, representing Inwood Community Club, met with Council Members about electrical work completed on the south concession stand before the 4th of July celebration. Updates needed to be completed to be able to use the new ice cream machine. A&J Electric estimated the cost at \$4000. Community Club would also like to purchase 10 more snow panels and cost share with the City.

Natalie Bohlke presented her monthly report.

Motion by Knobloch, second by Rozeboom to approve the Consent Agenda which includes minutes from June 12, Treasurer's report, and list of bills for payment. Carried 5-0.

Motion by Bixler, second by Knobloch to return to open session. Carried 5-0.

Mayor Brands presented information to increase Mayor and Council salaries. Motion by Knobloch, second by Rozeboom to increase the Mayor's salary to \$3600 per year plus \$80 for special meetings. Council Member pay will increase to \$80 per meeting. Carried 5-0.

Motion by Knobloch, second by Evans to adjourn. Carried 5-0.
